



MICHIGAN ASSOCIATION OF MAYORS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Michigan Association of Mayors (MAM) is the official nonpartisan organization of Michigan's chief elected officials, representing 101 Michigan communities. MAM works to assist the chief elected officials of cities, townships, and villages; advance the various interests and operations of communities represented by its members and all Michigan communities; promote cooperation among communities statewide; and advocate for local interests at the state and federal level.

The MAM Board of Directors is comprised of nine members plus the immediate past president. The MAM president serves as the spokesperson for the organization. The vice president and a diverse team of chief local officials complete the MAM Board of Directors.

Eligibility:

- Board members may be mayors, township supervisors, or village presidents from Michigan Municipal League full member communities. They must also be MAM members in good standing.

Term:

- Each board member serves a three-year term.

Expectations and Responsibilities:

- Attend board meetings typically held at the following dates and locations:
 - January, League Lansing Office
 - March, MML Capital Conference in Lansing
 - June, via conference call
 - November, League Lansing Office

Application Process:

- Nominations are made by a nominating committee selected by the president and may also be taken from the floor at the Annual Meeting.
- Interested candidates may send a letter of interest to Kelly Warren (see contact information below).

Selection Process:

- Three directors are elected each year by majority vote of the membership at the Annual Meeting.
