

The Historical Society of Michigan (HSM)—the state's oldest cultural organization—preserves and promotes the history of the Great Lakes State through:







Michigan History

- First published as a journal in 1917
 - Evolved into current magazine format in 1978
- Largest state history magazine in the United States
 - Circulation: 18,000 (Total readership over 100,000)
- In 2009, moved to HSM from State of Michigan
- Subscription is only \$24.95/year
- Published bi-monthly

 - Students can advance from local, toDistrict, to State, and even theNational level.








Michigan History Day's Impact on students...





Centennial Farm Program



- Established in 1948
 - HSM took over operation in 2008
- More than 6,100 certified Centennial Farms
- Recognizes farms with
 - Centennial Status: a working farm of 10 or more acres continuously owned by the same family for at least 100 years
 - Sesquicentennial Status: 150 years old
 - Bicentennial Status: 200 years. We have 4 in Michigan!



Milestone Awards

- Recognizes municipalities celebrating their 100th, 150th, or 200th anniversary.
- Recognizes the 50th, 100th, or 150th anniversary of organizations, businesses and municipalities.
- Cast aluminum plaques are finished in navy blue (organizations), brown (businesses), or burgundy (municipalities)


Michigan Heritage Home®


